Six Seniors Celebrate High School Careers

Six seniors will be ending their careers at the end of the season. A look back at their time spent as part of the Summit's soccer program show their involvement in many important games—8/30/2007: a 1-0 win against CCD on a late goal by Megan Jantsch; 10/15/2007: a first round state tournament 1-0 win against Bethel-Tate with the winning goal by Libby Meininger with 13:00 minutes remaining; 10/18/2007: a upset Sectional championship 1-0 win against Finneytown; 8/23/2008: the first win (2-0) against Wyoming in school history; 9/4/2008: 8-1 MVC victory over St. Bernard is the 100th MVC win in school history; 9/22/2008: the first win (1-0) against Indian Hill in 10 years; 9/10/2009: a 3-1 victory against CCD, a revenge win for the lone league loss last season; 10/22/2009: the Sectional Championship 1-0 win against CCD; 9/20/2010: the first win (4-0) over Mariemont in six seasons; 10/7/10: a win (6-1) against CHCA giving the team two consecutive MVC titles. The cumulative statistics for the senior class is: 15 varsity letters, 194 games played, 139 games started, 161 shots, 97 shots on goal, 21 goals scored, 6 game winners, 21 goals assisted, and 63 total points. Individually, Libby Meininger will graduate as the most decorated of the seniors. Libby will graduate as a four time all-SW Ohio Academic awardee, a 2010 all-Ohio Academic award winner, All-Southwest Ohio 2010 and a two time 1st team MVC player.

Classroom Excellence Continues

Members of the Summit soccer team know that their hard work does not stop on the field. It extends to the classroom. The 2009 varsity team is awaiting word to see if they will receive academic recognition from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America for a sixth consecutive year. The team registered a GPA of 3.89 last season and this season could prove to be just as successful. All six seniors received 2010 academic recognition: Hannah Hart, Libby Meininger and Lissie Russert will be named All-MVC and All-Southwest Academic for the fourth consecutive year. Lauren Meister, Katie Ann Sallada and Rachael Shreve will join the list as all-MVC and All-Southwest Ohio. Each of these six seniors will also be recognized as All Ohio Academic for the 2010 season. Congratulations on these major academic accomplishments.
