Code of Conduct (Coach)

***Maintain an open line of communication with your players' parents. Explain the goals and objectives of your team.**

***Winning is a consideration, but not the only one, nor the most important one. Care more about the child than winning the game. Remember, players are involved in sports for fun and enjoyment.**

***Be a positive role model to your players, display emotional maturity and be alert to the physical safety of players.**

***Be generous with your praise when it is deserved. Be consistent and honest. Be fair and just and do not criticize players publicly. Learn to be a more effective communicator and coach. Do not yell at players.**

***Adjust to the personal needs and problems of players and be a good listener. Never verbally or physically abuse a player or official. Give all players the opportunity to improve their skills, gain confidence and develop self-esteem. Teach them the basics.**

***Organize practices that are fun and challenging for your players. Familiarize yourself with the rules, techniques and strategies of your sport. Encourage all your to be team players.**

All players, coaches, parents and commissioners are expected to exhibit good sportsmanship and team values, and to generally uphold the principles and objectives of the Summit K-6 Parent Run Program. Any person associated with the program not exhibiting high standards of common human decency may be removed from the program at the discretion of the Board of Commissioners.
